Preparing Vegetables for Exhibit

Apples — Slightly polished.

Beans — Leave 1/2 inch of stem on pod. Uniform in color, straight and same length.

Beets — Trim tops 1-1/2 to 2 inches long. Trim roots to 2 inches. Do not scrub. Brush to remove dirt. 1-1/2 to 3 inches in diameter.

Broccoli — Remove all leaves below head. Minimum diameter of head is 3 inches. Minimum length of stalk and head is 5 inches. Heads firm; tight bud stage.

Cabbage — Do not peel excessively. 1 to 2 outer leaves to be left on. Trim close to head.

Carrots — Trim tops to 1 to 1-1/2 inch length. Do not scrub. 1 to 1-1/2 inch in diameter at crown.

Cauliflower — Leave stem 1 to 1-1/2 inches long. Trim jacket leaves even with top of head. Some of older leaves may be removed.

Cucumbers — Leave stems 1/2 inch long. Wipe clean with soft cloth. Size: Pickling, 2 to 3 inches; Dill, 3 to 5 inches; Slicing, 6 to 8 inches.

Dill — Cut seed heads with 10 to 12 inch stems. Exhibit two heads tied near lower end of stems. And again just below seed heads.

Eggplant — Do not wash. Leave 1 inch of stem. Light thumb pressure will leave a dent at proper harvest stage. Small blossom scar. Fresh green calyx.

Herbs — Rinse in cold water. Exhibit 4 to 6 inch sprigs in narrow bottles filled with water. 2 springs or stems per bottle.

Kohlrabi — Cut leaves to within 1 to 2 inches of stem, which is 1-1/2 to 3 inches in diameter. Light green color. Do not trim roots too closely.

Lettuce, leaf — Fresh, crisp, well colored leaves. Exhibit plant in water to prevent wilting. Remove older outer leaves that show yellowing.

Onions — Do not wash. Leave tops 1 inch above bulb. Trim roots to 1/4 inch. Remove only loose skins on outside.

Onions — Green - Remove loose skin. Cut tops 4 to 5 inches above white shank.

Parsnips — Trim tops to 1 inch length. Trim off side roots, but do not trim off lower portions of tap root.

Peas — Pick with stem. Rinse with cool water to clean. Bright green, well-filled pods with seeds in eating stage.

Peas (edible pod) — Pick with stem. Wipe off dirt with soft brush. Bright green, tender, flat pods with seed just beginning to form.

Peppers — Leave stem 1/2 to 1 inch long.

Potatoes — Do not wash. Wipe off dirt with soft cloth or brush.

Radishes — Roots are 1 inch in diameter. Gently wash in cool water. Remove discolored or injured leaves. Trim down tops, leaving 1 to 2 inches.

Rhubarb — Pull, do not cut stalks. Trim leaves so only 1 inch of leaf blade remains attached to stalk.

Squash — Cut with 2 inches of stem attached. Do not wash. Clean with soft brush. Zucchini type should be 4 to 8 inches long. Flat or scalloped types should be 3 to 5 inches in diameter. Rind should be soft in summer squash; hard and glossy in winter squash.

Tomatoes — Remove stems. Clean with soft cloth.

Turnips — Cut tops back 1 to 2 inches. Leave 2 inches of tap root. Do not scrub.

This contest is designed to test your skills in designing your own creative and unique quilt block pattern. The Fair has worked with owner Kathy Wilgenbusch of The Quiltmaker's Shoppe in Manchester to pick out great fabrics to work with in making your blocks. A fun pattern has been chosen and paired with complimenting colors and fabrics to complete the kit. Quilters can stop in to the Fair Office, The Quiltmaker's Shoppe or the Extension Office to pick up their kit. Kits will be available by April 4th. The cost of the kit is \$5 and will be used to offset the cost of the fabric and quilting the blocks after the fair. The completed blocks need to be returned to one of these places by May 15th. All of the blocks will be displayed in the Open Class Creative Arts and Floral Hall during the Fair and fair-goers will have an opportunity to vote for their favorite block. The winner will be awarded a \$25 gift certificate from The Quiltmaker's Shoppe. The completed quilt will be sold at the 2016 Fair.

RULES:

- 1. Contest is limited to 50 Participants.
- 2. Contestant will pay \$5.00 per kit, one kit per exhibitor
- 3. Exhibitor must use all fabrics that are included in the kit but must NOT add fabrics
- 4. Appliqueing is allowed, quilting and machine or hand embroidery is NOT allowed.
- 5. Paper piecing is allowed but must take off the backing yourself before entering your block
- 6. Exhibitor may use an established pattern or create an original block. The block size must be
- 9 1/2" by 9 1/2" and will finish 9" X 9".
- 7. Blocks entered become the property of the Delaware County Fair Society, Inc. Blocks will be made into a quilt and sold the following year with the proceeds going to the Delaware County Fair.

- 8. All specimens to be exhibited in clear glass bottles, if possible, and all containers to be marked and labeled plainly on bottom of owner's identification and owner is solely responsible for their exhibit and container.

- 9. All specimens must be grown by exhibitor and all house plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for three months.
- 10. Foliage permitted in artistic design classes unless otherwise stated.
- 11. All artistic design classes must be work of the exhibitors, but not necessarily grown by them.
- 12. The educational value of the show will be increased if exhibitors will list names of plant material used. (Extra points will be given for house plants and specimens that are named.)
- 13. Judging will be done according to the rules of the new National Handbook and Flower Show Directive of the National Council State Garden Club. Inc.
- 14. A novice is an exhibitor that has never won a blue ribbon at the fair in the particular division exhibited.
